This application is specific to United Texas Credit Union ONLY and CANNOT be used to apply to other BCSCH Scholarships.

The Bexar County Scholarship Clearing House (BCSCH) is a <u>Clearing House</u> for scholarships. This means we offer a standardized application form and register applicants at a central location. This saves time for students, plus aids the sponsoring organization in their selection process. <u>The deadline is 4:00 p.m. FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2023.</u>

Submitting a scholarship application <u>does not guarantee</u> a scholarship. Therefore, you are encouraged to apply for <u>all</u> financial aid opportunities available to you through other sources, including the financial aid office at the college or university of your choice.

Completing your application with attention to every detail plays an important part in your chances of being selected as a scholarship recipient. Please note the following helpful hints:

- **<u>Remember deadlines</u>**: Being responsible for meeting deadlines shows you are ready for college. There will be no exceptions to the deadline noted above.
- <u>Do not leave any blanks</u>: For example, do not skip the financial information section or forget to have your parent sign in the Acknowledgement section (both student and parent must sign)
- Don't be shy: about your school and community activities. Attaching a personal résumé is suggested.
- The Verification of Eligibility: section of the application (page 3) must be completed for this scholarship
- <u>The Letter of Recommendation</u>: needs to be from an adult who is not a relative. It should reference your character in regard to truthfulness, conscientiousness, and the ability to accept responsibility.
- <u>Transcripts and Exam Scores</u>: your transcript, SAT and/or ACT scores are required with your application
- A <u>Personal Narrative or Autobiography:</u> is required; limited to 200-400 words, <u>typed</u>. Remember to edit and use spell check. A well-written submission is often the deciding factor among highly ranked candidates. Within your essay, include a description of your educational and career goals, choice of college and if/how a Specific person, event or situation impacted your decision. Print your name at the top and sign at the bottom.

- 1. Children, stepchildren or grandchildren of United Texas Credit Union employees, Board members or officials are not eligible to apply.
- 2. If you are chosen as an award recipient, a representative from United Texas Credit Union will contact you directly. BCSCH is **not** responsible for notifying scholarship winners.
